Todd Eric Lovato is a Santa Fe native and the managing editor of SantaFe.com, where he manages some 40 community bloggers, some two-dozen freelance writers and the web presence of Hutton Broadcasting's six terrestrial radio stations, including KBAC Radio Free Santa Fe, Blu 102.9, Talk 1260 KTRC and ESPN 1400. He holds a bachelor's degree in Communication & Journalism from University of New Mexico and an MBA in finance from College of Santa Fe. Before joining SantaFe.com in April, Lovato worked at KUNM public radio, as a staff writer for the Albuquerque Journal, and most recently, as media and public relations director at Santa Fe Community College. With five New Mexico Music Industry Awards to his name, Todd is also a musician, producer and the owner of an independent record label.

Bruce Krasnow is an assistant city editor at The New Mexican where he supervises daily news coverage with a special interest in the economy. A native of Chicago, he's worked as a journalist in Chicago, Florida and Washington State before coming to New Mexico in 1995.
